





Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Did you ever wonder why we ask priests to bless things? A blessing, in its most basic sense, is when God bestows favor upon you; it is to receive his help and his gifts. For example, at the beginning of creation "God created man in his image... God blessed them, saying: 'Be fertile and multiply...'" (Genesis 1:27-29). All blessings have their origin in God.

Lay people, non-priests, can give their blessing, asking God to bestow favor on that person. We see in the Old Testament, for example, of how a father was supposed to give his special blessing to the oldest son. There is a famous story in Genesis chapter 27 of how Jacob (the younger brother) tricked his father Isaac into giving him the blessing rather than to Esau (the older brother).

A priest's blessing, however, is a bit different. When a man is ordained a priest, he is changed in his very being; he is conformed to Christ the high priest and head of the Church. For that reason, priesthood is not a job; it is a vocation. At Mass, a priest is able to say the words of Jesus from the Last Supper, and the bread and wine are changed into the Body and Blood of Christ. He is acting *in persona Christi capitis*, in the person of Christ the head.


Likewise, when a priest blesses someone or something, it is Christ himself who blesses in and through the person of the priest. Even if the priest is not especially holy, his blessing is ultimately that of Christ, who instituted the priesthood for the sake of his people, the Church.



# GOSPEL REFLECTION



# He sent them out two by two.

nce I asked a fallen-away
Catholic friend of mine
what he remembered about
the parish priest from his youth.
He said, "He was a gentle, nice guy.
Kind of vanilla. Kept to himself."
It struck me that he, perhaps like
many, perceive Catholic priests as
the following: lonely, harmless, and
self-sufficient. As a challenge both to
this perception (accurate or not) and
to us priests who perhaps feel a pull
in that uninspiring direction, stands
the mighty image of what we see in
the Gospel this Sunday.

Jesus sent out his apostles, "two-by-two, with power over demons, and without money belts." Two-by-two: they enjoyed deep fellowship and brotherhood. Power over demons: they were anything but harmless. These men wielded enormous power against evil. Without money belts: they were not self-sufficient. They needed others to help them. Not lonely, but in community. Not harmless but armed with massive spiritual energy. Not self-sufficient, but poor and in need of help.

This is a challenge to me, and perhaps to all of us, living in a rich, secularized, and individualized culture. Do I embrace my priestly ministry in deep fellowship with other priests? Do I speak and act boldly to drive out evil where it is found? Do I live poorly and simply, trusting in the help of those around me even for basic needs?

The fruitfulness of priestly ministry largely depends on these three traits. Let's pray for all priests — and, by extension, all of us Christians — to live more like Jesus' communal, poor, and powerful apostles.




