Dear Friends,

Dietrich Bonhoeffer was a Lutheran minister in Germany during the Nazi era who wrote a well-known book, The Cost of Discipleship. A long-time public opponent of the Nazi regime, he was arrested in 1943 and eventually sent to the Flossenburg concentration camp, where he was executed in 1945. He exemplified what it means to be a disciple of Jesus. There is a cost, and he paid the ultimate cost.

In the Gospel today, Jesus says these challenging words to his disciples, "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me. For whoever wishes to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake and that of the gospel will save it." Mark 8:35

These are tough words, but they are at the heart of the Christian vocation. This vocation, beginning with Baptism, is at the center of the life of each Christian who sincerely desires to live the faith. It is subordinating my own desire to Jesus and the Cross.

Pope Benedict XVI spoke these beautiful words at a World Youth Day years ago:

Are we not perhaps all afraid in some way? If we let Christ enter fully into our lives, if we open ourselves totally to him, are we not afraid that He might take something away from us? Are we not perhaps afraid to give up something significant, something unique, something that makes life so beautiful? Do we not then risk ending up diminished and deprived of our freedom?. .. No! If we let Christ into our lives, we lose nothing, nothing, absolutely nothing of what makes life free, beautiful and great. No! Only in this friendship are the doors of life opened wide... I say to you...Do not be afraid of Christ! He takes nothing away, and he gives you everything. When we give ourselves to him, we receive a hundredfold in return. Yes, open, open wide the doors to Christ – and you will find true life. Amen.

St. James PADS Shelter Opening in October *Volunteers are needed to serve the unhoused in our area.*

In a few short weeks we will open the doors of our church to the vulnerable and unhoused in our area. We are grateful to be able to offer shelter, showers, laundry and warm meals. This is only possible with consistent, generous support from the community. The St. James PADS Site will open the first Wednesday in October and continue through the end of April, and we are still in need of volunteers for our 2024/2025 season. We are able to accommodate any travel plans you may have over the season and are grateful for any help you can give.

If you worked with PADS in the past, please come back and continue to nourish the spirit of those in need and mentor new volunteers. If you have not volunteered before, please join one of our volunteer teams, and check with your friends to see if you would like to work together on a shift. Many parishioners and others in the community have formed lifelong bonds with their fellow volunteers through this program. Serving others is a connection like no other. The commitment can be as small as four hours per month or as often as you are available.

Shift Volunteers work on either the first, second, third or fourth Wednesday of the month covering shifts of 4-5 hours during the hours of 7:00 pm -7:00 am. During this time the volunteers monitor and serve the needs of the guests with showers, sleeping arrangements and laundry. Shift Volunteers must be 18 or older, or 16 with a parent. New volunteers will have access to a brief training.

Food Teams sign up for either the first, second, third or fourth Wednesday of the month to provide and/or serve warm dinner for the guests (signing up to drop off either an entrée, side, or dessert from a given menu).

There will be additional opportunities for small groups, scouts, youth groups, community groups, teams, ministries, etc.
