Today's Readings

Dear Friends,

The Church has a well-developed reflection on what are licit and illicit forms of cooperation with the evil actions of others.

Traditional Catholic moral theology has discerned several different forms of cooperation. I do not have space here to offer a complete list of all the different kinds that have been proposed by moral theologians, but I will focus on two.

Formal Cooperation

The first is formal cooperation, which occurs when we mentally assent to the act with which we are cooperating. For example, if someone is robbing a bank, and we help him, agreeing to the bank robbery (not because we are being forced into it), then we are formally cooperating with the heist. In such a case, we share in the moral character of the act.

Material Cooperation

Material cooperation in evil refers to cooperating in another's evil act, but either unknowingly or in a way far removed from the act. For example, a merchant selling a kitchen knife which is later used in harming another is remote cooperation. There is not moral culpability on the part of the merchant.

Proportionate Reason

Some actions (such as abortion and euthanasia) are intrinsically evil and can never be justified.

However, Catholic moral theology allows that remote material cooperation with an evil action may be justifiable in certain circumstances - in the presence of proportionate reasons.

In such a situation, casting one's vote for a candidate who supports an intrinsically evil act as a matter of his or her policy can only be justified if there is a greater evil espoused by the other candidate. It does not amount to an endorsement of immoral policies. Rather, it represents an attempt to reign in the greater harm that otherwise will result.

Obviously, promotion of abortion, an intrinsically immoral act, is a grave evil. There is no imaginable proportionate reason.

Jobs, the economy, taxes, education, the environment, immigration? All of these are important issues. But it is hard to imagine how any of them provides a proportionate reason to vote for a candidate supporting the murder of children.

What to do when both major candidates support legal abortion? And what about these other important issues – Jobs, the economy, taxes, education, the environment, immigration?


